

Dear Member

Your committee is pleased to announce that the next issue of the Occasional Papers is ready to be printed.

Written by our Secretary, David Attwood, the subject is the history and development of a piece of land known as Blakefield situated in Bromyard Road, St John's in Worcester, from the 15th century to the end of the 19th. It charts the ownership from the Prior, and Dean and Chapter, of Worcester Cathedral until the land was enfranchised in 1860, its sale, various tenants, and the subsequent development of housing in the last quarter of the 19th century.

This part of Worcester's development and history uses documents from the Cathedral Library and Worcestershire Archives, examining the builders, solicitors, and owners, supplemented with illustrations from the Worcester City Planning Applications which have been digitally photographed and made available for research.

In line with the commitment made when the publishing of the Journal ended, every member household will receive a free copy, but to keep the cost of printing to a reasonable level (colour is very expensive) the default edition come with monochrome photographs and plans, with only a few maps annotated in colour for clarity. We anticipate that many members would prefer to receive a version with all-colour illustrations, so we are offering you the opportunity to upgrade to a full colour version for £5. We will be making this available outside the society for £10 per copy so this represents good value. To help with your decision, there are reduced size comparison illustrations printed on the next page.

For those who would prefer to receive the full colour version, these will only be available to Members who register their preference using the slip below, by or at the 4th October meeting with a payment of £5. All other members will receive the monochrome version. To save on postage, copies of both versions will be available at the 8th November meeting, any uncollected will be hand delivered as far as practical.



